OBEDIENCE & RALLY TRIAL PRIZES

QUALIFYING SCORE IS REQUIRED FOR ALL RIBBONS AND PRIZES IN THE REGULAR OBEDIENCE AND RALLY CLASSES

RIBBONS & TROPHIES WILL BE PRESENTED IN THE RING. Special prizes/trophies will be presented on Saturday and Sunday following the last regular class. It is the responsibility of the handler of each dog to claim any and all trophies. No trophies will be mailed. The Club is not responsible for lost or broken trophies after presentation. All trophies not used or claimed at the Trial become the property of the Club, to be used at future trials in the donor's name.

TRIAL PRIZES

A complete list of prizes and trophies offered, can be obtained after the closing date by writing or calling the Show Secretary.

RALLY REGULATIONS

SECTION 1. RALLY NOVICE CLASS. All exercises are judged on leash and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on a leash. The leash must be made of fabric or leather and needs to be long enough to provide adequate slack.

Rally Novice A Class. Dogs competing in this class may not have won an AKC Rally Novice (RN) title or any AKC Novice, Open, or Utility title. A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. The handler may not have previously handled any dog that has earned an AKC Rally title or any AKC Novice, Open or Utility title.

Rally Novice B Class. Dogs completing the Rally Novice (RN) title may continue to compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

SECTION 2. ADVANCED RALLY CLASS. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

Rally Advanced A Class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (RN) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (RA) title or any AKC Novice, Open or Utility title. A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. After a dog earns the Rally Advanced (RA) title, it may continue to compete in this class for 60 days.

Rally Advanced B Class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (RN) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (RA) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

SECTION 3. RALLY EXCELLENT CLASS. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

Rally Excellent A Class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (RE) title or any AKC Novice, Open or Utility title. A handler must own the dog entered or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. After earning the Rally Excellent (RE) title, the dog may continue to compete in this class for 60 days.

Rally Excellent B Class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (RE) title may continue to compete indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

CHAPTER 4. NON-REGULAR RALLY CLASSES

Section 1. Rally Pairs Class. Competition by handlers working two dogs at one time through a rally course at level selected by event-giving club. Scores based on possible 200 points, with ties broken by time. All stations counted with a point value. Maximum that can be deducted at any one station is 10 points per dog (20 total). No NQ's are awarded. Possible for a team to get a negative score. All other rally rules for each class offered apply.

Section 4. Rally Team Class. Any of the regular class levels may be offered. Teams will consist of 4 handlers with a total of 400 points for each team. All team members run the course individually with the team time running continuously. Time starts when the judge orders the first handler "Forward". Each subsequent dog starts when the dog before it crosses the finish line. Timing stops when the last dog in the team crosses the finish line. All stations are assigned a point value. Maximum deducted at any station is 10 points. Possible for team to have a negative score.

OBEDIENCE AND RALLY ENTRANTS – PLEASE NOTE:

After a dog earns a title, it may be moved up to the next class in a future trial even though the closing date for the trial has passed. This move-up may be requested if, according to the owner's records, the dog has completed the requirements for the title after the closing date of the trial in which the advanced entry is to be made. The request for a move-up must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. Move-ups may be approved, provided the next level class and judge is available and the class has not reached its limit.

OBEDIENCE AND RALLY ENTRANTS – ATTENTION PLEASE

Please make sure to read the rules about class eligibility before entering.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 3

SECTION 1. NOVICE CLASS A. The Novice A Class shall be for dogs not less than six months of age that have not won the CD title. A handler must own the dog entered, or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family and may not have previously handled any other dog that has earned an AKC Novice, Open or Utility title. A person may enter more than one dog in this class but the same person who handled each dog in the first five exercises must handle each dog in the Long Sit and Long Down exercises. However, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first four exercises, he/she must have an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for the Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both Novice A and Novice B at any one trial.

SECTION 2. NOVICE CLASS B. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class to earn a CD title. A person may handle more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have separate handler for the Long Sit and Long Down exercises when judged in the same group. No dog may be entered in both Novice A and Novice B classes at any one trial.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 4

SECTION 1. OPEN CLASS A. The Open A Class shall be for dogs that have won the CD title but have not won the CDX title. Anyone who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH may not enter or handle dogs in this class. Each dog must be handled by its owner or by a member of the owner's household or immediate family. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person shall handle the dog in the group exercises as in the first five exercises; however, he/she must have an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both the Open A and Open B classes at any one trial.

SECTION 2. OPEN CLASS B. The Open B class will be for dogs that have won the CD or CDX titles. A dog may continue to compete in this class after it has won the UD title. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class but the same person who handled each dog in the first five exercises must handle each dog in the Long Sit and Long Down exercises. However, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first five exercises, he/she must provide an additional handler for each additional dog, when more than one dog is judged in the same group for the Long Sit and Long Down. No dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B classes at any one trial.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 5

SECTION 1. UTILITY CLASS A. The Utility A class shall be for those dogs that have won the CDX title, but have not won the UD title. Anyone who has trained or exhibited a dog that has won an OTCH may not enter or handle dogs in this class. Each dog must be handled by its owner or by a member of the owner's immediate family or household. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class.

SECTION 2. UTILITY CLASS B. The Utility B class shall be for dogs that have won the CDX or UD title. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class and owners may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial.

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE OPTIONAL TITLING CLASSES

CHAPTER 6. GRADUATE NOVICE CLASS. The Graduate Novice class shall be for dogs that have not won a Graduate Novice title (GN). The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may handle more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the Long Down group exercise. If eligible, dogs entered in Graduate Novice may also be entered in any other obedience class. Exercises include: heel on leash and figure 8 (40), drop on recall (40), dumbbell recall (30), recall over high jump (30), recall over broad jump (30) and long down (30).

CHAPTER 7. GRADUATE OPEN CLASS. The Graduate Open class shall be for dogs that have not won the GO title. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. If eligible, dogs entered in Graduate Open may also be entered in any other obedience class. The exercises are to be performed and scored as in the Open and Utility classes. Exercises in order of judging include: Signal Exercise (40), Scent Discrimination (30), Directed Retrieve (30), Moving Stand and Examination (30), Go Out (30), Directed Jumping (40).

AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 10 NON-REGULAR CLASSES

SECTION 5. VETERANS CLASS. The Veterans class shall be for dogs that have an obedience title and are at least seven years old on the date of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and Judged as in the Novice class. Dogs may be entered in another class or classes.

SECTION 8. PRE-NOVICE CLASS. The Pre-Novice Class shall be for dogs that have not received a third qualifying score in a Novice class prior to the closing of the trial. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class; however, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first four exercises, that person must provide a handler for the additional dog in the group exercises. All exercises will be scored as in the Novice class, except the dogs will perform all exercises on leash, which should be 6 feet in length. The exercises include: heel on leash (45), figure eight (25), stand for examination (30), recall (40), long sit (30) and long down (30).

NEW NON-REGULAR CLASS - Versatile Veterans Non-Regular Obedience Class -

The Versatile Veterans Class shall be for dogs that are at least seven (7) years of age. The dog may NOT compete in this class if it is also entered in the regular open or utility classes. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. There will be no group exercises in this class. Dogs entered in this class are to jump at the nearest higher multiple of 2 to half of the dog's height at the withers. All dogs must perform the Signal Exercise as described in the regular utility class OR the heel free and figure 8 exercise as described in the regular open class (25 points). Seven exercises from the Open and Utility regular classes (Drop on Recall, Retrieve on the Flat, Retrieve over the High Jump, Moving Stand, Scent Discrimination, Directed Retrieve, Directed Jumping) are available. The dog must perform five of the seven exercises, with the handler indicating which exercises will be excluded at the time that the armband is picked up during check-in. The open/utility exercises will be performed as in the regular classes, with each exercise being worth 35 points. Total points for the class will be 200.

(Each first Obedience entry includes 50 cents AKC recording fee & \$3.00 Event Service Fee. Each second entry includes \$3.00 Event Service Fee. There are no AKC fees on non-regular obedience classes.)

\$27.00 for first Regular Rally entry, \$18.00 for second regular rally entry of same dog. Non-regular rally classes: \$15 per pair in Rally Pairs and \$40.00 per Team in Rally Team (Obedience Event is separate for entry fees)

(Each Rally entry Includes AKC \$3.00 recording fee. There are no AKC fees on non-regular rally classes.)

Please note: Do not count Sunday as 2nd entry from Saturday & Do not count Rally as a 2nd entry to Obedience—Separate days and Separate Events

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES IS: 8:00PM Wednesday, 7 October 2009, after which time entries cannot be accepted, canceled or changed, except as provided for in chapter 11 Section 6 of the Dog Show Rules. The Program of Judging will be mailed to each entrant prior to the show. This can be done electronically for those who provide email information on entry forms.

Acknowledgment of entries will be made as soon as possible after entries have closed. Should the exhibitor not receive acknowledgment within a reasonable time, please notify the Show Secretary. **NO Overnight entries are accepted without waiver signed off to be left.** This applies to all mail delivery agencies (USPO, FED EX, DHL, UPS etc.)

NSF or returned checks require cash payment of entry fee plus \$25.00 NSF fee and any bank fees. *Conditional, Unsigned, Incomplete or Telephone Entries Cannot Be Accepted.*

THERE ARE NO ON-LINE ENTRIES FOR THESE TRIALS

ENTRY FEES will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, nor if the dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge or barred from competition by the Show Committee or because it has been entered incorrectly. If because of riots, civil disturbances, weather or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entries will be made.

IF A DOG IS ENTERED in more than one class, the highest priced class shall be considered the first entry. The show giving club may decline any entries for cause or indebtedness to the club over thirty days past due. The club may refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show premises due to disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or any official thereof for such action.

NO ENTRY shall be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance.

To be acceptable an entry must be submitted with the required entry fee on an official AKC entry form. DOGS entered in a wrong class may not be transferred to another class. **HANDLERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING SURE THEIR DOGS ARE ENTERED IN THE CORRECT CLASS. THE CLUB CANNOT CHANGE CLASSES ONCE ENTRIES HAVE CLOSED.** Changes must be received in writing prior to the closing date and time. Email is acceptable: Striebich@aol.com

DOTCA will refund 50% of entry fee to entrants whose bitch comes in season after entries have closed. Refund may be obtained by sending a written statement to trial secretary. The Trial Secretary must receive the certificate minimum of 30 minutes prior to start of judging.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTERING DOGS

Select the classes for which your dog is eligible, then fill out the entry completely. Please TYPE or PRINT clearly, the Club assumes no liability for wrong information.

PLEASE remember to include only AKC Titles, OFA and CERF numbers
(other titles/certificates are not printed in AKC catalogs)

Some special trophies may be donated based on official AKC titles. Special trophies may be offered for Junior Handlers. Please help us make sure yours are correct. Including OFA and CERF numbers in the show catalog is permitted. The complete numbers should be written on the entry form following the name of the dog. If not using the attached entry form, please make sure you are using the most current one available on AKC through downloading.

EVENT RULES

ALL DOGS shall be held on leash except when in the Obedience Ring. There shall be no drilling nor intensive or corrective training of dogs on the show grounds or premises. The use of corrective devices is strictly prohibited on the show grounds. Exhibitors must be governed by any rules or regulations of civil authorities or building/ parking regulations.

EXHIBITORS and HANDLERS will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their crates and for cleaning up after their dogs.

DOGS SHOULD BE PRESENT in ample time before their scheduled judging time and they may be removed as soon as they are no longer needed for competition. Once brought into the grounds, a dog entered in this show may not be withheld from competition unless excused by a Judge, Veterinarian or the Show Committee.

JUDGES WILL NOT WAIT for any dog holding up a class. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance to the judging ring when the class is scheduled to be judged. Owners or handlers of the dog are solely responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. It is not the responsibility of the ring steward to locate any dog, its owner or handler when the dog's presence is needed in the show ring. Only dogs entered at this show are allowed on show grounds.

THE MANAGEMENT will exercise every precaution for the safety of the dogs exhibited and it is understood that neither the club nor the management nor the landlord will be responsible for the loss of, damage to, or any other damage caused by any dog for any cause.

THE SHOW COMMITTEE will use due diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in the show.

THE WELFARE OF AN EXHIBITOR'S CHILD is the responsibility of the exhibitor, who must exercise control and restraint over the child while the child is on the show premises. Failure to do so will result in action by the show committee.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Dog Obedience Training Club of Anchorage does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official AKC entry form for this event.

AN EXERCISE AREA will be provided outside the building. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to take care of their dogs and to clean any area soiled by their dogs.
